Established in the year 1994, Shri Guru Gobind Singh Jee Government College Paonta Sahib has earned its name after Shri Guru Gobind Ji ,the tenth Sikh Guru who sojourned here between 1685-1689.It is believed that he spent most of his time here meditating and experiencing spiritual bliss.He wrote many religious books here and then went to Anandpur Sahib to establish the Khalsa Panth .The Gurudwara houses a museum which contains antiques and weapons used by Guru Gobind Singh during his stay.

The college campus is spread over 16 acres of land in village Shubh Khera at a distance of 1.5km from the bus stand . The college has a large playground.The spacious and fully air conditioned library is equipped with more than 9000 books and has digital accessibility through N -List , funded by UGC as college component under UGCINFONETDigital Library Consortium. The campus is under CCTV surveillance and has Wi-Fi system for online connectivity. The college is affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University (HPU),Shimla and recognised by the University Grants Commission(UGC) of India, New Delhi. The college provides undergraduate degree courses in BA/B Com/BSc; professional degrees in BCA/PGDCA and post graduate degree in English ,Economics, Political Science, Hindi and Commerce.

The college achieved B++ grade in its first NAAC accreditation cycle for its quality oriented approach and potential for growth in Academic session 2016-17and received infrastructure grants of 1.5crores under RUSA .

e. Steps taken by the College to improve the quality of education:

The strength of the college is increasing every year as the college boasts of an atmosphere conducive to teaching and learning. The faculty is well qualified and attends to the needs of the students with dedication.

The college library has acquired 8758 books in all. The library subscribes to 20 magazines, 8 journals and 12 newspapers. The resource centre set up in the library from UGC funds has 5 computers and a printer from which the students and staff are benefitting.

In Public administration faculty was hired on temporary basis during the peak session for the benefit of students.

Infrastructure: The height of the boundary wall of the college playground was raised and it was fenced with barbed wire on top. The weeds were uprooted and the grass was cut. The construction of the science block is underway. The herbal garden and botanical gardens were fenced with iron grills. Around 120 decorative and medicinal plants were planted last year in the college campus.

The canteen was further upgraded to create a separate sitting area for the faculty. This area has been marked as the mobile zone for students.

Pahal; the cultural extravaganza of the college was organized with enthusiastic participation of students in the stage performances. a lot of students showcased their talent at gift wrapping, rangoli making, clay modeling, slogan writing, poster making and painting through various competitions organized by the various societies and clubs of the college, viz., NSS, Ranger & Rovers, Red ribbon club, Eco-club etc.; on various topics related to water conservation, nutrition, Drug Abuse, AIDS awareness,

climate change, etc. . Various talks were organized on universal franchise, Nutrition, communal Harmony and other topics. other important days like Yoga Day, Constitution Day, National Science Day, National Sports Day, Voting Awareness were observed in the college. an exhibition showcasing the creative talents of the students was inaugurated on the first day of PAHAL. This year too, the college magazine

BHANUJA captured the highlights of the previous year and the creative genius of our students in its various pages. The career Guidance Cell organized a special inter-faculty career counseling session and a special lecture on civil service preparation for the benefit of the students.
