Results of Analysis of Students' Feedback Regarding Curriculum

Academic Session 2020-21

Students are the direct beneficiary of the college and hence are the major Stakeholders. Their feedback is a prime factor for the enhancement of the learning environment and can help teachers to enhance their skills. Students' feedback on Course curriculum at SGGSJ Govt. College Paonta Sahib is designed to get know on students' opinion about the curriculum. It is also decisive factor for improving course delivery and students' learning experience. A feedback of 1570 students of various courses was sought for the academic session 2020-21.

Feedback from students allows them the opportunity to comment on various aspects of curriculum. This provides us with valuable suggestion for further improvement of the curriculum, which can be forwarded to the University for further action.

Methodology

The curriculum feedback from parents has been collected through structured questionnaire, which includes 15 questions on various aspects of curriculum.

1570 responses of Students' feedback forms on curriculum have been received on different papers taught by them. A Five Point Likert Scale has been used with weights assigned from 1 to 5 to different levels as follows:

1= Strongly Disagree/ Highly Dissatisfied/ Lack/Very Bad

2= Disagree/ Dissatisfied/ Inadequate/Bad

3= Neutral / No Opinion/ Average

4= Agree/ Satisfied / Adequate/Good

5 = Strongly Agree/ Highly Satisfied/ Abundance/ Very Good

The range of each level is determined by the following formula:

Highest point on Likert Scale-Lowest Point on Likert Scale)/Number of Levels used

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Therefore: Range= $(5-1)/5 \Rightarrow 4/5 \Rightarrow 0.8$


Table 1 show that out of 1570 students surveyed, 1527 students have answered question no. 1. Out of 1527 students 222 students i.e. 14.1% of students strongly agree that the contents of the curriculum are relevant to the courses and program, 1141 students i.e. 72.7% of student have agree for the same. 144 i.e. 9.2 % of students have neutral opinion, 14 students disagree with the statement and 6 students strongly disagree that the contents of the curriculum are relevant to the course and program.

The result to question 1 are presented below as shown in Graph 1.

Here, it is also observed that the weighted mean score of Question no. 1 is 4.02 which lies between the Likert range of 3.4 to 4.2 i.e., "Agree". So it can be concluded that there is agreement among students that the contents of the curriculum are relevant to the course and program.



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Table 2 displays that out of 1527 respondents 201 i.e., 12.8% of students strongly agree that the contents of the curriculum are up to date, 1095 i.e., 69.7% of students agree for the same. 203 students i.e. 12.9% of respondents have neutral opinion. While 22 students i.e. 1.4% of respondents disagree that the contents of the curriculum are up to date and 6 students strongly disagrees fort the same.

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

Table 3 displays the results of responses collected for question 3. Out of total 1525 respondents 244 students i.e., 15.5% of the respondents strongly agree that enough academic flexibility is embedded in the curriculum which provides opportunities to students to pursue their interests and needs, 1107 students i.e., 70.5% of respondents agree and 127 students have neutral opinion for the same. While 35

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students i.e., 2.2% of respondents disagree and 12 students strongly disagree that curriculum provides enough academic flexibility which provides opportunities to students to pursue their interests and needs.


Graph 3 presents a frequency of responses categorized on the Likert scale.

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Table 4 shows the results of students' responses to question 4. Out of 1510 responses received 165 students i.e., 10.5% of students strongly agree and 1003 students i.e., 63.9% of the respondent agree that the size of the curriculum is appropriate in terms of load on the students. While 85 students i.e., 5.4% of the respondents disagree, 11 i.e., less than 1% students strongly disagree and 246 i.e., 15.7% of respondents have neutral opinion about load of curriculum on student.


Graph 4 presents a frequency of responses categorized on the Likert scale.

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Table 5 shows that out of 1506 respondents 185 students i.e., 11.8% of respondents strongly agree and 1016 students i.e., 64.7% of respondents agree that curriculum fosters entrepreneurship. While 50 i.e., 3.2% of students disagree, 11 students strongly disagree, and 244 students have neutral opinion regarding curriculum fostering entrepreneurship in them.


Graph 5 presents a frequency of responses categorized on the Likert scale.

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Table 6 displays the responses received for Question no. 6. Out of 1515 responses received, 328 students i.e., 20.9% of respondents strongly agree and 1057 students i.e., 67.3% of respondents agree that curriculum supports higher learning. While 20 students i.e., 1.3% of respondents disagree and 11 students strongly disagree that their curriculum supports higher learning among students. 99 students have neutral opinion regarding the same.

Graph 6 presents a frequency of responses categorized on the Likert scale.

Here, it is also observed that the weighted mean score of Question no. 6 is 4.10 which lies between the Likert range of 3.4 to 4.2 i.e., "Agree". So it can be concluded that there is agreement among students that curriculum supports and promotes higher learning among them.

Question No: (7) Career-orientation of the curriculum and development of various job-oriented skills in students



It is evident from Table 7 that the responses of 1510 students have been received for question 7. Out of total 1510 responses 217 students i.e., 13.8% of respondents strongly agree and 1060 students i.e., 67.5% of respondents agree that the curriculum is career oriented and develops various job-oriented skills in students. 
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Table 8 shows the responses received for question 8. Out of total 1506 responses received, 169 students i.e. 10.8% of respondents are highly satisfied with the balance of theory and application in the curriculum and 1081 students i.e. 68.9% of respondents are satisfied with the same. On the other hand 43 students i.e. 2.7 % of respondents are dissatisfied and 10 students are highly dissatisfied with the combination of theory and application in curriculum. 203 students i.e. 12.9% of students have neutral opinion for the same.

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

Table 9 exhibits that out of 1508 students responded to question 9, 452 students i.e., 28.8% of respondents find the teaching-learning environment of the college very good. 822 students i.e., 52.4% of the respondents find the teaching-learning environment to be Good. While 19 students i.e., 1.2% of students find the teaching-learning environment to be Bad and 11 students find the same Very Bad. And 204 students find the teaching-learning environment of the college to be average.

Graph 9 presents a frequency of responses categorized on the Likert scale.

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

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Table 10 displays the responses to question 10. Out of total 1508 students' 409 students i.e. 26% of respondents find the availability of prescribed textbooks and reference books in the college library to be very good and 842 students i.e. 53.6 percent of respondents find the same to be Good. While, 27 students 1.7% of respondents find the availability of prescribed textbooks and reference books in college library to be Bad and 15 students finds the same very bad. 215 students i.e. 13.7% of respondents find the same Average.

Graph 10 presents a frequency of responses categorized on the Likert scale.

Here, it is also observed that the weighted mean score of Question no. 10 is 4.06 which lies between the Likert range of 3.4 to 4.2 i.e. "Good". So, it can be concluded that the students find the availability of prescribed textbooks and reference books in college library to be Good.

Table 11 displays the responses to question 11. Out of total 1512 students' 323 students i.e., 20.6% of respondents find the availability and accessibility of online educational resources in the college to be very good and 857 students i.e., 54.6 percent of respondents find the same to be Good. While, 50 students 3.2 % of respondents find the availability and accessibility of online educational resources in the college to be Bad and 21 students finds the same very bad. 261 students i.e., 16.6% of respondents find the same Average.

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
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Graph: 11 Percentage response to availability and accessibility of online educational resources in the college

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

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

Out of total 1498 responses received, 170 students i.e. 10.8% of respondents are highly satisfied with the use of ICT enabled teaching material by teachers in the curriculum delivery and 969 students i.e.

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61.7% of respondents are satisfied with the same. On the other hand 46 students i.e. 2.9 % of respondents are dissatisfied and 13 students are highly dissatisfied with the use of ICT enabled teaching material by teachers in the curriculum delivery. 300 students i.e. 19.1% of students have neutral opinion for the same.

Here, it is also observed that the weighted mean score of Question no. 13 is 3.83 which lies between the Likert range of 3.4 to 4.2 i.e., "satisfied". 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

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
